

# Pastor's Note

The season after Epiphany, like the Season after Pentecost is named *Ordinary Time, so* called, because each of our Sundays are numbered (i.e., ordinals) not because these days are dull. And yet there is something to the ordinariness of it. We are no longer living the joy of Christmas lights or the happy surprise of Epiphany. We are not yet journeying with Jesus on the road to the cross. These days, all the days in February this year, just are.

And our ordinary time is full of an unsettling new <u>normal</u>. We are two years into a pandemic, and we are still having to contend with masks, social distancing, staff shortages at schools and local businesses, and overfull hospitals. We have yet another mild winter with not enough snow on the mountains to keep our water table healthy. The political divisions deepen as Republicans and Democrats both peddle their own versions of reality. Everybody speaks their truth. No one is listening. The anxiety of the age has become our everyday life—our *Ordinary Time*.

One of the hazards of these anxious times is that we find it so easy to find things to worry about. With nostalgia tinted glasses, we remember *the way things were* and we bemoan the state of things. We complain about having to contend with ongoing restrictions. The numbered Sundays of Ordinary Time are an invitation for us to see Christ, not just in the special seasons and the Church's high-holy-days, but amid our everyday life. It is a summons away from anxiety to awe, as we grow in grace as disciples of Christ.

My prayer for us in our anxious *Ordinary Times* is that we would lean into Jesus and, in the words of 1 Peter 5:7, we would 'cast our cares on him, for he cares for us.' And that we would awaken to wonder as we sense Christ's abiding presence with us, our ordinary transformed into something extraordinary!

PALM (Provide A Loving Meal) is a free dinner every Tuesday and Sunday from 5:00 to 6:30. It is located in the Fellowship Hall of the First United Methodist Church, which is the lower level door closest to 9<sup>th</sup> and High Streets.

PALM is a volunteer program. It is funded by your donations. The Klamath Falls First United Methodist Church provides the Fellowship Hall, some maintenance, and utilities.

PALM provides from 85 to 257 plates of food each meal. Families, neighborhood residents, and even people who simply want the social interaction of a meal come in. Most people walk.

Volunteers from the Methodist Church, colleges, other churches, and many others come together to help.

Please come and visit, eat, help in the kitchen, or donate.



# Financial Report

### **MEMBERS and FRIENDS**

January 2022 has closed. All bills and taxes have been paid. The monthly payroll was made. Operating income for the month totaled \$4,522.19. Operating expenses totaled \$9009.04. Income lagged expenses by \$4,486.85. In addition to payroll expenses (\$3,757.36), operating expenses included a budgeted payment of \$1,036.00 for Conference Apportionments. This represents the first of 12 payments toward the 2022 goal of \$12,422.00.

As we enter February 2022, we have an Operating Fund balance of \$136,094.80. However, a portion of these monies are contained in outside, or side pocket, funds which have nothing to do with budgeted operating monies. As of the first of January, six (6) such funds existed. The funds and their respective balances:

Youth Group: \$576.86 Organ: \$4,348.51 PALM dinners: \$12,297.01

Camperships: \$150.00 Memorial Fund: \$14,505.47

**Special Needs Fund: \$45,645.20\*** 

After subtracting out the total of the 6 funds (\$77,523.05) there is a carryover to February 2022 of actual OPERATING monies totaling \$58,571.75. Financially, for the near term outlook (2-5 years), we are in a weak position, treading water at best. We entered 2022 with a carryover from 2021 totaling \$63,058.60. Because monthly income is anticipated to lag monthly expenses, the carryover will continue to erode.

As of February 2022 the Capital (Trustee) Fund Balance is \$3,965.73. For the present, we are no longer using the security service we employed throughout 2021.


