Pastor's Note

Spring has sprung and we have already seen the signs of the world's reawakening: wildflowers in the grass, buds on the trees, and bird song in the crisp cold of the morning. The grey-brown hillsides suddenly are full of verdant greens and wisps of color. As Gerard Manley Hopkins once wrote, "The world is charged with the grandeur of God!" *The earth is the Lord's and the Fullness thereof*!

Spring always catches me off guard, especially this year, after what has been a fairly mild winter. The lack of snow on the mountains, and our low water table means the possibility of another dry, hot summer. But before that we have the gift of Spring, with its promise of new life.

The Christian church in the northern hemisphere celebrates Easter in the Spring, when these metaphors of resurrection are close at hand. The crocus, the tulip, and daffodil rise up from the earth, the Flora and Fauna reappear, and bare branches of the plum trees come alive, and teem with blossoms. We watch the world wake up, and we are reminded yet again of the Creator's handiwork.

It was two years ago in March 2020 when everything shut down because of COVID-19. We were then in the season of Lent and the church was already exploring the rhythms of fasting, deprivation, and doing without. Nobody then knew what these past two years would cost us (we didn't know it would be two years!). We didn't know the things we would miss out on, the loneliness and hard times. But here we are, it is Spring of the Year of the Lord, 2022. Jesus has been raised from the dead, and the world around you is full of new life, and the old life that our seasons forgot. The world again is alive!

Make sure you take time to enjoy the sights and smells and all the splashes of color that Spring has brought in her wake! This is the season of resurrection, and it is worth enjoying and celebrating! Yes, there will still be hard days ahead and there are issues we are still facing as a culture (e.g. a reeling economy, the peril of war, the menace of summer wildfires, etc.) and personally. The faith that carried us through some difficult days this past two years, will still be a reservoir we will need to draw on. But let's not rush ahead of ourselves. There is life all around us ready to fill our hearts with wonder. *Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!*

PALM Dinners Served

PALM (Provide A Loving Meal) is a free dinner every Tuesday and Sunday from 5:00 to 6:30. It is located in the Fellowship Hall of the First United Methodist Church, which is the lower level door closest to 9th and High Streets.

PALM is a volunteer program. It is funded by your donations. The Klamath Falls First United Methodist Church provides the Fellowship Hall, some maintenance, and utilities.

PALM provides from 85 to 257 plates of food each meal. Families, neighborhood residents, and even people who simply want the social interaction of a meal come in. Most people walk.

Volunteers from the Methodist Church, colleges, other churches, and many others come together to help.

Please come and visit, eat, help in the kitchen, or donate.



Financial Report

MEMBERS and FRIENDS

MARCH 2022 has closed. All bills and taxes have been paid. The monthly payroll was made. Operating income for the month totaled \$4,590.26. Operating expenses totaled \$5,881.98. Income lagged expenses by \$1,291.72. In addition to payroll expenses (\$3,287.94), operating expenses included a budgeted payment of \$1,036.00 for Conference Apportionments. This represents the third of 12 payments toward the 2022 goal of \$12,422.00. The 3 payments total \$3,108 (25% of goal).

As we enter April 2022 we have an Operating Fund balance of \$130,762.36. However, a portion of these monies are contained in outside or side pocket funds which have nothing to do with budgeted operating monies. As of the first of April, six (6) such funds existed. The funds and their respective balances:

Youth Group: \$576.86 Organ: \$4,348.51 PALM dinners: \$9,981.21

Camperships: \$150.00 Memorial Fund: \$14,505.47

Special Needs Fund: \$45,645.20*

After subtracting out the total of the 6 funds (\$75,207.25) there is a carryover to April 2022 of actual OPERATING monies totaling \$55,555.11. Financially, for the near term outlook (2-5 years), we are in a weak position treading water at best. We entered 2022 with a carryover from 2021 totaling \$63,058.60. Because monthly income is anticipated to lag monthly expenses, the carryover will continue to erode. In the first three months, the carryover has eroded by 11.90%.

As of April 2022, the Capital (Trustee) Fund Balance is \$3,621.49. For the present, we are no longer using the security service we employed throughout 2021. During the month, there was a bit of activity in this fund: \$3,000.00 was expended for the balance required by Seasons Change LLC, for the \$6,200.00 installation of two new gas heaters (one for the church office and one for the library).




