
We will celebrate the Christian church's birthday with cake, balloons, and decorations.

Pastor's Note

I grew up singing these lines in Sunday school:

Read your Bible, pray every day, and you'll grow, grow, grow. And you'll grow, grow, grow. And you'll grow, grow, grow. Read your Bible, pray every day, and you'll grow, grow, grow, grow.

These lines can have a moralistic ring to it as though *real Christians* are the ones that read their Bible daily and make time to pray, the rest of us who are less consistent are somehow less than. I try to carve out devotional time, but I miss days and sometimes play catch-up. I pray every day, but often in a haphazard, occasional way. Something comes up and I pray about it. Other days I have a time set aside to spend with God. Those are the good days, but my practice is not perfect.

But let me share something I am learning about daily prayer: doing it daily makes it easier. Have you ever let the pots and pans pile up from the weekend and then you go to do the dishes, and it suddenly a much bigger job? Or one I am dealing with right now is weeding. I have a garden plot that fell into disuse, and I have spent hours pulling weeds, turning the soil, and trying to get it ready for kale, zucchini, and tomatoes. And I am not there yet! Once my garden is in, weed management becomes much easier. I will already be there watering and tending the plants, harvesting lettuce and herbs every day. Pulling weeds will become just a thing to do when I am out there already and not something that requires heroic effort.

Prayer is like that. Do you find it difficult to pray? Does God feel distant? Do you long for a deeper, more satisfying prayer life? We all go through seasons where prayer feels less easy and we wonder where God is, but as we learn the habit of daily prayer it becomes less work and more enjoyable. We have more time to water and tend and harvest the things which God has planted in our lives. Daily does not have to mean drudgery. By establishing intentional routines, we get to experience all God has in store for us. And we *grow, grow, grow, grow.*

Sermon Series "Livin' on a Prayer" The Lord's Prayer

The only spiritual practice the disciples asked Jesus how to do was pray, "Lord, teach us to pray!" (Luke 11:1). Jesus's response was to teach the disciples the prayer we have come to call the Lord's Prayer and our congregation, in one voice with the Church universal, still prays these words every Sunday. As Christ has taught us, we are bold to say!

But how often do we take time to consider what the words of this prayer really mean? Just 57 words in the original Greek (the Matthew version of the prayer), these words have shaped our understanding of prayer, the spiritual life, and the mission of the church. From **June 26-July 24**, we will be doing a 5-week sermon series looking at the Lord's prayer line-by-line. Our hope is that as we inhabit the prayer Jesus gave to his disciples, we will grow more in our ability to sense God's presence, God's will and God's tender care for us.

Pastor's Discretionary Fund

What is this fund?

There will be 2 more PALM dinners in the month of May.

PALM (Provide A Loving Meal) is a free dinner every Tuesday and Sunday from 5:00 to 6:30. It is located in the Fellowship Hall of the First United Methodist Church, which is the lower level door closest to 9th and High Streets.

PALM is a volunteer program. It is funded by your donations. The Klamath Falls First United Methodist Church provides the Fellowship Hall, some maintenance, and utilities.

PALM provides from 85 to 257 plates of food each meal. Families, neighborhood residents, and even people who simply want the social interaction of a meal come in. Most people walk.

Volunteers from the Methodist Church, colleges, other churches, and many others come together to help.

Please come and visit, eat, help in the kitchen, or donate.



Financial Report

MEMBERS and FRIENDS

MAY 2022 has closed. All bills and taxes have been paid. The monthly payroll was made. Operating income for the month totaled \$4,502.45. Operating expenses totaled \$6,614.80. Income lagged expenses by \$2,112.35. In addition to payroll expenses (\$2,989.34), operating expenses included a budgeted payment of \$1,036.00 for Conference Apportionments. This represents the fifth of 12 payments toward the 2022 goal of \$12,422.00. The 5 payments total \$5,180 (41.7% of goal).

As we enter June 2022, we have an Operating Fund balance of \$126,464.47. However, a portion of these monies are contained in outside, or side pocket, funds which have nothing to do with budgeted operating monies. As of the first of June, seven (7) such funds existed. The funds and their respective balances:

Youth Group: \$576.86 Organ: \$4,348.51 PALM dinners: \$10,104.58

Camperships: \$150.00 Memorial Fund: \$14,005.47

Benevolences: \$317.00 (Special Sunday UMCOR collection to be forwarded to Conference HQ)

Special Needs Fund: \$45,645.20*

After subtracting out the total of the 7 funds (\$75,147.62) there is a carryover to June 2022 of actual OPERATING monies totaling \$51,316.85. Financially, for the near term outlook (2-5 years), we are in a weak position treading water at best. We entered 2022 with a carryover from 2021 totaling \$63,058.60. As of June 1st, the carryover has eroded 18.62%. Ongoing monthly income is anticipated to lag monthly expenses, and monthly carryover will continue to erode. Sometime late next year (2023), without a major cash infusion, I anticipate the carryover will disappear completely as we move into a negative balance.

As of June, 2022, the Capital (Trustee) Fund Balance is: \$6,626.75. During the month, \$5,500.00 was transferred in from the Parsonage Maintenance Fund (PMF) to cover future Council approved expenditures.


